



## THE SITUATION

The City of Denver is the largest city in Colorado as well as the state capital. Denver is nicknamed the Mile-High City because its elevation is exactly 5,280 feet above sea level, making it one of the highest major cities in the United States. Denver is one of the few cities in history that was not built on a road, railroad, lake, navigable river or body of water when it was founded. It just happened to be where the first few flakes of gold were found in 1858.

Colorado Precast Concrete was contacted by the City of Denver in regards to their slippery manhole covers on their sidewalks. The drawings Colorado Precast received specified *Slip*NOT® Metal Safety Flooring's all metal slip resistant coating.

## THE SOLUTION

SlipNOT® coated 1" x 23-7/8" diameter Grade 2 steel on steel mill finish customer supplied iron manhole covers, which were seamlessly installed on the city's sidewalk. The new manhole covers make a statement to pedestrians that all street trash and water run-off goes straight to the river, which pollutes the river and affects the fish. The city hopes that the new

manhole covers might strike a conversation concerning our environment, plus they're much more appealing with a slip resistant surface.
